A Word from Father Drummond

The twenty-first Ecumenical Council, Vatican II, as I previously noted was not called to deal with any heresy as was the case with previous councils but was intended to be a “pastoral” council. In calling the council St. John XXIII is supposed to have said that, “it was time to open the windows of the Church and let in some air.” The joke is sometimes given that he forgot to put in the screens before opening the windows. Opening in October 1962 under Pope John XXIII, the council met four times before it was closed by Pope Paul VI in 1965. The impact the Council had on the Church is without parallel.

The Council released sixteen documents: four Constitutions, three declarations and nine decrees. The Constitutions were and are the most important and of these the one most widely and significantly felt by the Church at large was the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, *Sacrosanctum Concilium*. (The Latin titles of the documents are the opening first two words). *Sacrosanctum Concilium* was solemnly promulgated by Pope Paul VI on December 4, 1963, which means it has the full force of the Magisterium, or the teaching authority of the Church behind it.

What S.C. significantly did *not* do was to abolish the liturgical use of Latin: “The use of Latin language is to be maintained in the Latin rites, except where a particular law might indicate otherwise.” (section 36.1) It did, however allow

for the use of the “local language” for “readings, instructions given to the people, and in *some* prayers and in *some* of the singing.” (sec. 36.2) (Italics are mine).

The Constitution noted that, “the liturgy consists both of a part that cannot be changed insofar as it has been divinely laid down, and also of parts that are subject to modification...” (sec. 21) The document itself did not change the Roman Missal but laid down the groundwork for its modification. Just as the so-called Tridentine Mass was not promulgated by the Council of Trent, so the “New” Mass was not promulgated by Vatican II. In both cases new *Missals* were promulgated by the sitting pope, St. Pius V and Blessed Paul VI respectively.

When Pope Pius V promulgated his new Missal, he issued the Papal Bull (meaning a document with his official seal or “bulla”), *Quo Primum*, this in 1570. Critics of the Missal of Paul VI like to cite *Quo Primum* because in it St. Pius V seems to prevent any possible change—present or future—to the Missal. It is important to note here that it is the entire Missal that is addressed, not just the Canon of the Mass. He specifically states that even Patriarchs or Cardinals do not have the power to introduce any prayers other than those in the Missal, and later goes on to say that the document “cannot be revoked or modified, but remain always valid and retain its full force...” (but then lists some exceptions including) “...decrees of the Holy See, as well as any general or special constitutions or edicts of provincial or synodal councils...”

As Pope, Pius certainly had the ability to bind even Patriarchs and Cardinals, but not future popes. Nor did he intend to. The Missal of Pius V underwent a number of revisions in its history, the first made by St. Pius himself when he introduces into the Missal a new feast, commemorating the Victory of the Battle of Lepanto, the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. As the text of the Vulgate Bible was amended, so too were texts within the Missal of Pius V; first by Pope Clement VIII in 1604, and again thirty years later by Pope Urban VIII. Pope Pius X introduced major changes in rubrics. Pope Pius XII made major changes to the celebration of Holy Week, making them obligatory in 1955. And even Pope John XIII introduced the name of St. Joseph into the Roman Canon.

Unfortunately, mass confusion (to make an unintended pun) followed in the wake of the Second Vatican Council. Between the close of the Council and the release of The Missal of Paul VI some years later, various “intermediate” Missals of dubious worth were used and S.C. was deliberately, I believe, misinterpreted, with the wide spread replacement of vernacular for the Latin. Once that ship sailed, there was little chance of turning back. However, the normative text of the Missal of Paul VI is the Latin Text. Sadly, the first translation into English was faulty in many ways, sometimes deliberately so. The latest translation is much more accurate but sometimes choppy in the English.

Whatever its faults, the Missal of Paul VI is the standard form of the Mass today. When done properly and with due reverence, it is beautiful — as the Mass should be.

When Pope Benedict XVI issued his *Motu Proprio, Summorum Pontificum*, allowing for the widespread use of the 1962 Missal, his idea was, in part, that there might be some “cross germination” between the two. Referring to the 1962 Missal as the “Extraordinary Rite” he made clear that he had no intention that it should supplant the Missal of Paul VI.
