Thanksgiving Holiday Schedule

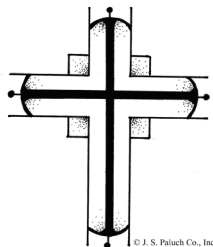
November 22nd: no evening confessions *nor* devotions.
